Term: Durable Medical Equipment (DME)Support: Project Sweet Peas

Durable Medical Equipment (DME): The medical equipment you may need to have at home prior to discharge of your baby. With Premies it can include such items such as oxygen tanks, pulse oximeter monitors for oxygen saturation, monitors for apnea and bradycardia, and feeding tube equipment. If your doctor prescribes any type of DME for home use, you will be trained by a professional on how to use the equipment.



Deb's Take: Becky came home on oxygen and an apnea monitor. I was scared to death that I was unable to medically care for her, but swallowed hard and listened to EVERY word the DME trainer told me about the equipment and how to use it. Here I was thinking that post-NICU we'd be bringing home a baby, not all of these accessories. So my husband called me at work one day to let me know the oxygen tanks had been delivered. I will never forget the word he used to describe the big tank in her room: "HUGE." I got home and stared at the pale green tank. "Hey, that's cool," I noted, "Becky's tank kind of matches the décor."

The Genius:

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Q&A with Parents of Premies Day Founder, Nick Hall

To help us get ready for Parents of Premies Day (www.ParentsofPremiesDay.org) on Sunday, March 10, 2013, we checked in with founder Nick Hall:

Q: Why was Parents of Premies Day created?

A: Because even though moms and dads of premies display amazing courage and strength every day, their commitment to their children often goes unrecognized. We just wanted more people to understand that it's moms and dads doing things like standing vigil over isolettes and advocating for medically fragile children who help premies grow and thrive.

Q: So what should this day evoke for parents of premies?

A: Parents of Premies Day is a chance for preemie moms and dads to feel proud of everything they have accomplished and have helped their children accomplish. Parents in general seldom get applauded for what they do, and parents of premies do so much and bear so much. Knowing that they are being celebrated and that they are appreciated is so important.
