Term: Colostrum

Colostrum: The yellow-ish breast milk that comes out after you start pumping breast milk or breastfeeding in general. breastfeeding. It is also known as "Liquid Gold" by the nurses because it provides muchneeded fats and nutrients for your baby.

Gregg came back and excitedly told me the nurse was thrilled and was currently rushing it down to the NICU - that it was "Liquid Gold."

The Gold Rush had nothing on how I felt at that moment. I felt like I had won the lottery and could do something to help my daughter.





Q & A: The Hand to Hold "For the Love of Babies" Program

Hand to Hold, a national NICU parent support program has launched its "For the Love of Babies" campaign happening now until 30 April 2013. Public Awareness Director, Amy Carr gives us the background on this event:

Q: How did this special fundraiser come about?
