Term: Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)


Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV): An illness initially resembling a modest cold in adults. It can be dangerous for newborns – and even worse for preemies – since it is highly contagious and complications from the virus can develop into a major respiratory infection. Many premature infants with Chronic Lung Disease will be eligible for Synagis injections on an annual basis during cold and flu season.

After the NICU: RSV & Synagis Preparation

Parents are often behind the eight ball when getting ready for Respiratory Syncytial Virus season. Here are some quick reminders:

- Talk to the doctor ***now*** about precautions needed this season.
- Call/Meet with the pediatrician or specialist's office now to work on a pre-approval of Synagis from insurance so as to not miss doses due to "red tape."
- Prepare family and friends now regarding visitation and more.
- Get those doctors appointments for the family done now to avoid unnecessary outings.
- Look at ways to get through isolation: books, videos, Skype chats with others, etc.....

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CHANGES: AAP Revises Synagis Guidelines

In early August the Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) released its latest Red Book guidelines for Synagis, a monoclonal antibody given monthly by injection to help in prevention of RSV in high-risk infants such as premature babies. In short, the changes reduce dosing to only 28-weeker preemies (they have to be born prior to 29 weeks) and the lower gestational ages for only one season based upon specific criteria.

While PremieWorld appreciates the AAP's focus on reducing costs to the patient, there are concerns that these guidelines are based upon studies that have small population numbers, that do not have realistic

costs involved related to hospitalization and post-discharge needs with RSV and therefore does not properly represent all premature infants properly.

If there were to be a full impartial and non-political study of this issue that showed Synagis is not useful to specific populations as listed in the latest set of guidelines, then PremieWorld would fully support it. However, our requests have been ignored.
