## Term: Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV): An illness initially resembling a modest cold in adults. It can be dangerous for newborns – and even worse for preemies – since it is highly contagious and complications from the virus can develop into a major respiratory infection. Many premature infants with Chronic Lung Disease will be eligible for Synagis injections on an annual basis during cold and flu season.



### **Questions to Ask the Doctor:**

- What is being done by the team to protect my baby from RSV in the NICU?
- What should I do to protect my baby in the NICU?
- What should I do to protect my baby at home?
- What medications are available to help?




