

While many pediatricians will take a "wait and see" approach to your child's development, it is okay to disagree. How to prep for that discussion at check-up time:

- Bring a developmental log we have developed a great one for you: <u>http://bit.ly/milestonelog</u>
- Bring other observations grandparents, teachers, child care, but make sure you get it in writing.
- Proactive vs. Reactive: Be clear to the doctor that you are an expert of your child and that you are connected in the preemie parent community where the proactive approach is always stressed over the reactive approach. *Research shows this approach is always better.*

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Q & A: Advice for Parents & Pros Regarding Preemies

Saroj Saigal, MD, FRCP (C), Professor Emerita Pediatrics at McMaster University and Pediatrician in their Neonatal Follow-Up Program has written Preemie Voices, (review p.3) which details the outcomes of very premature infants now, in their 30s, in their own writing. We asked her for advice...

What would you like for parents to know? Infants respond remarkably to being at home and thrive on parental interaction. At school, the incidence of learning problems is 2-3 times more common in very premature infants compared to infants born at term. As they grow older, some children may face math difficulties, and a higher proportion will require special education assistance. However the majority of premature infants graduate from high school, and many even go onto postsecondary education. Learning difficulties in premature infants are challenging, both for the children and their parents. Encouragement and a positive attitude are essential.

What would you like professionals to know?

Until recently, not much was known about how very premature children fared in their roles and responsibilities as young adults. We now know that despite the earlier development lags and disabilities, the majority of very premature children are very resilient, and function surprisingly better than we had expected.
