MATT: The Film

The Genius:

MATT is a true testimony to the resilience of preemies as they get older and take on life.

The short film is centered around Matt (who had been born 3 months premature at 1.5 lbs. and had suffered brain trauma), is now a senior at Santa Monica High School and becomes a member of the varsity football team and later the basketball team.

The film is a solid reminder of what it means to break barriers to be a part of society despite the odds. Matt on his own brought together a team, a school and a community that showed him respect and admiration.

After the NICU: *Visiting the Dentist*

Though your preemie's teeth might not even be in yet, a visit to the dentist early on is a smart idea. Here's why:

- Some preemies have what is called *delayed eruption*, meaning they can come in later than is normally expected.
- A dentist can give you some tips on gum care and pre-brushing ideas to help with teething and any other issues can come up.
- Since teeth can affect feeding, talk to the dentist about ways to keep your child moving forward on feeding though the teeth might not be in yet.
- See if your dentist would suggest you take your child to see a pediatric dentist.

Tips: Preparing for a Pediatric Dentist

Many preemie parents decide to take their child to a pediatric dentist. These dental specialists are like the pediatrician for teeth. Learn more:

- Ask your pediatrician if a pediatric dentist is a good choice for your child. If so you can find a pediatric dentist here at the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry website at: www.aapd.org
- Pediatric dentists are an excellent way to educate yourself and your child on proper oral healthcare in terms of brushing, flossing, and even a healthy diet.
- Not all dental plans cover pediatric dentists. Make sure to check your health plan before making an appointment so you know if you are in-network or out-of-network. If you think you have a specific need for a pediatric dentist that warrants coverage, see if your pediatrician or your family dentist can help talk to your insurance company.
