
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Preemie Genius: The Littlest Peanut

In essence they have traded being at the hospital with bringing the world into their house in the form of visiting nurses, nursing care, medical equipment vendors, therapists and more. Here are a couple of tips to keep sanity and a schedule:

Set Specific Hours. The doctors have set office hours, why not you? Set up chunks of time for these incoming appointments.

Be Firm. It is time to learn the *polite version* of "no" and stick to it. You have done enough working around everyone else. They need to help you for a change. Remember you are your baby's advocate!



Parent Tips for Pros: Breastfeeding

NICU professionals know the value of breast milk for premature babies. Yet it is often difficult for mothers to not only attempt breastfeeding but to succeed at it. Here are some tips from "the other side":

Tip #1: Let's work together.

Mothers of premature babies are often isolated and overwhelmed with all of this. Breastfeeding in and of itself seems insurmountable considering all of the equipment, all of the stress and more. Sit down with the mother and let her know that while you are her baby's team you are also *her team*, too. Ask how you can help make breastfeeding happen – then *do it*.

Tip #2: *Celebrate the Mom Milestones.*

Preemie Moms are caught up in the milestone charts for their babies so why not give them something to aim for as well? Maybe it is pumping breast milk for 20 minutes for the first time. Then for 2 days, then a week, then 2 weeks, then a month, etc. Practicing latching on could be another milestone. Add in drinking a certain goal of water each day and maintaining a healthy diet. The goal is to keep them trying and moving ahead with success along the way. Always focus on the positive with every step.
