



After the NICU: Developmental Concerns

Parents of preemies are on a constant conveyor belt of worry about their child's development. Yet so many later preterm infants are not entered into Early Intervention straight from between eating what is good and the NICU because of either a lack of need at discharge time or due to state budget cuts. Here are some tips for parents without EI services in place to consider to get help:

> **Health Department.** The Health Department is likely to have services in place to help monitor infant development or can refer a parent to another program locally for this type of development.

EI Evaluations. At any time a parent feels there is a concern, they should contact Early Intervention for an evaluation. Consider doing this every 6 months - 1 year.

Parent Tips for Pros: Building Parent/Baby Bond

In the midst of the busy NICU schedules professionals are often at a loss as to how they can help promote a healthy parent/child bond without losing valuable work time. Some tips:

Tip #1: Talk, read or sing to the baby. Parents appreciate any moment they can be a superior of the baby.

Parents appreciate any moment they can have with their child to do something "normal" and talking and/or reading is just that – *normal*. Remind them that these moments do not have to be filled with Shakespeare or some high-end book or song that promotes baby genius. Just the sound of the parent's voice in person or on tape stimulates that baby and continues that bonding process from the womb.

Tip #2: Leave "love notes" for the parent.

Parents of preemies often feel extreme isolation, a lack of support from family and friends and more. Give them a little "love" from the baby with some love notes on the incubator when they walk in the door such as: 1) "I love you Mommy/Daddy!" 2) "I am proud of you Mom/Dad!" and 3) How about some Kangaroo Care today, Mom/Dad?"
