Alone in a grocery store bathroom I discovered I was in preterm labor. 30 hours later at my home hospital, Becky was born at 30 weeks at 2 lbs. 15.5 oz with a tiny kitten cry. We are now 16 years out with with multiple disability diagnoses. Are we sure Moms-to-be are the only ones that need to be "aware"? *Think again.*



'Soon' tells the heartwarming story of the journey of a preemie, inspired by author, Jessica Watson's own NICU experience with her children.






PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR NICU GRAD

As your baby grows and heals in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, you will have a lot to do. It can be overwhelming at times. Go slowly, but don't procrastinate. Preparation gives you a chance to allviate some of your anxious energy to make the transition home easier. Here are some tips for preparing yourself, your home and your family for baby's arrival home:

- ✓ **Create a traffic control plan for visitors.** Your needs deserve top priority and entertaining, even the most well intentioned friends and family is probably not top on your list. It's okay to let visitors know you need time to ajust to a new baby and to keep germs away. Stick to your schedule and let everyone know when you are ready for visitors.
- ✓ **Siblings.** Prepare older children for what life may look like when baby brother or sister comes home. Block out special time with all of your children to help them feel included and encourage them to talk about their feelings.
- ✓ **Prepare for an emergency - before one arises.** NICU Grads have the highest rate of re-hospitalization than the average newborn. Prior to discharge, know your hospital routes, emergency entrance and parking. Program all care providers phone numbers in your phone.
- ✓ **Self care.** #1 rule - Proper support cannot be given to your preemie before taking care of yourself first. Rest, eat, shower and don't be afraid to ask for help so you can step away for some much deserved "me" time.
