When I had my daughter Becky at 30 weeks almost 14 years ago, I automatically assumed the NICU staff knew more about her needs than I did.

With each day of my daughter's NICU stay, I gained confidence in her care. This did not come easily at all. I struggled with first-time mother doubts, huge amounts of guilt and quite frankly, fear. I had no idea what lay ahead for my daughter.

I struggled with learning the medical terms, with handling medical equipment and follow-up appointments at home all wondering aloud what this meant for my daughter's long-term outcome. You see, there was something that my brain kept telling me that no one else knew: that I was the expert of my child, that I had a gut instinct that was steering me in the right direction.

TERM: DEVELOPMENTAL DELAY




Developmental Delay

Babies are expected to reach certain milestones (i.e. walking and talking) within a predictable amount of time. Preemies, due to their early birth and subsequent medical challenges, may take longer to reach those milestones. May Preemies receive occupational therapy and/or physical therapy to deal with all the various issues of being born too early: the stress it puts on the muscles, the stiffness in the bodies of infants that are on the vent for any length of time, etc. This therapy is very important for your baby. If your baby is vented, ask your nurse to get an occupational therapist (OT)/physical therapist (PT consultation.

Other Tips:

- ✓ Ask to have the OT/PT session scheduled for when you are able to be there.
- Talk to the OT/PT about ways you can bond with your baby, help with development now and going home.
- Ask the doctor now about plans for referrals for therapy after the NICU.
- At discharge, if your baby does not qualify for Early Intervention, ask what other local resources are available to help you.

Little Angel Wings helps bereaved families who have experienced the loss of a baby/child at any age/gestation.


PROGRAMS:



When it comes to your preemie's development, you are the key person to get things moving on evaluations, on appointments, on therapy and long-term progress. **Learn about Deb's story on why advocacy is so important:** http://preemie.us/PreemieFight Some tips:

- Se consistent at pediatrician appointments about your baby's delays. Make sure they are documented.
- ☑ Being the nice parent is not always what is best for your child. Don't be rude, but speak up and loudly if need be.
- Contact your local Early Intervention program to get your child evaluated. If you are already in EI, call the coordinator if you feel that things are not going in the right direction. *Don't wait*.
- ✓ Know that you are the expert of your child. Trust your expertise of your child and get help now.
